HALL RENTAL

Penfield has two halls available for private functions. Both are air conditioned, and can be rented for birthday parties, weddings, graduations, showers, and etc. Township residents' funeral luncheons can be held free of charge. Community groups, such as scouts and 4H, can use the hall for their meetings free of charge.

The "Community Room" is a 48' X 48' hall with an adjoining kitchen containing a warming oven, refrigerator, microwave, and coffee pots. It rents for \$300. It has theater-style seating capacity of 312 (chairs only) and banquet-style seating capacity of 145 (chairs and tables). It features rectangular and round tables, and padded chairs. An additional \$200 security deposit is required and returned when the hall is left in satisfactory condition.

The "Township Meeting Hall" is smaller and rents for \$100. It has theater-style seating capacity of 60 and banquet-style seating capacity of 42. It has electrical outlets for roasters, crock pots, or coffee makers, but no kitchen access. Tables and chairs are included. An additional \$50 security deposit is required and returned when the hall is left in satisfactory condition.

Availability of both halls can be checked on our website, but must be verified.

RECREATION PARK NEWS

Wellington Fire District

Continued emphasis on smoke detectors

According to the U.S. Fire Administration, three out of five residential fire deaths occur in properties where there are no smoke detectors, or non-working smoke detectors.

There are currently two types of smoke detectors on the market which detect two different types of fires. First is the Ionization detector, which is generally more responsive to flaming fires. The second type is the photoelectric detector which responds quicker to smoldering fires. Studies have proven that the Photoelectric will alarm quicker, thus giving the home's occupants more time to escape. There are also smoke detectors that provide both types in a single device. Also on the market are smoke detectors for the hearing impaired. These devices will be equipped with a strobe light or vibrating feature to help gain the attention of those that may be unable to hear an audible alert. When choosing a smoke detector, it is the recommendation of the fire district that you choose a photoelectric, or a device that contains both alerting methods for maximum protection.

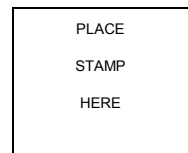
